- 1 What was the one point from the sermon that impacted you the most?
- 2 Describe a time in which you knew what God wanted you to do but you saw obstacles to accomplishing it.
- 3 Rahab lied in order to protect the spies and herself. What are your thoughts about this in light of the context, the morality, and God's sovereign plan?
- 4 Why doesn't this particular passage assess the morality of Rahab's lie? Does this mean that there can be circumstances in which we are justified in doing or saying something contrary to God's commands?
- 5 The spies in Joshua 2 (verse 24) saw their enemies "melting in fear" at the prospect of invasion. Most of the spies in Numbers 13 (read 13:1,2, 26–33) were "melting in fear" at the prospect of facing their enemies. Are there times in which the biggest variable is not the circumstances or the obstacles, but our perspective? Explain, and share a personal example.
- 6 Rahab was a very flawed person in the eyes of many, but she was greatly used by God. How does that encourage you? How does that encourage your view of others?
