EXPLORE

- 1 What has been your biggest discovery or reminder in our *Made for a Mission* series thus far, including the priority of the nations in Scripture and the progress of the Gospel in our world?
- 2 If someone asks you what an unreached people group is and why it matters, what would you say? What would be indications that you personally thought it mattered (Matthew 24:14, 28:19,20; Romans 15:17–22)?
- 3 When you consider a life of Great Commission participation (the Gospel to the nations), what is your greatest challenge or source of confusion: the *why*, the *what*, the *where*, the *how*, or the *with whom*? Describe.
- 4 Which of the “practices of a world Christian” is most intriguing or compelling to you? What is a practical step you can take to see those practices become your pattern?
- 5 Paul wrote about his willingness to adjust to different cultural settings and kinds of people in 1 Corinthians 9, then he concluded by saying “I have become all thing to all men so that by all possible means I might save some. I do all this for the sake of the Gospel, that I may share in its blessings” (1 Corinthians 9:22,23). At present, how true is that statement for you? Would you like to be able to say that?
- 6 For followers of Jesus, is deployment for the Great Commission a duty or a delight? Describe your answer and support it with biblical evidence. What difference does this attitude make?
- 7 We often think our choices or circumstances up until now inevitably determine our choices and circumstances in the future, but what if today was “a new day, the first day of the rest of our lives?” What could that mean for your Great Commission focus and participation?

PRAY

Ask God to give you increasing clarity on the terms of your deployment and the courage to gladly embrace them, including whatever life adjustments they may entail (Matthew 9:37,38).
