Living with Integrity

My dear brothers, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry,

for man's anger does not bring about the righteous life that God desires.

Therefore, get rid of all moral filth and the evil that is so prevalent and humbly accept the Word planted in you, which can save you.

Do not merely listen to the Word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says.

Anyone who listens to the Word but does not do what it says is like a man who looks at his face in a mirror

and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like.


But the man who looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues to do this, not forgetting what he has heard, but doing it — he will be blessed in what he does.

If anyone considers himself religious and yet does not keep a tight rein on his tongue, he deceives himself and his religion is worthless.

Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.

Receive the Word Humbly (1:19-21)

When you receive the Word with meekness, you accept it, do not argue with it, and honor it as the Word of God. You do not try to twist it to confirm it to your thinking.



Obey the Word Diligently (1:22-25)

You have not really listened to the Word if you have not obeyed the Word.

I am frighteningly convinced that countless people within the Church listen to the Word week by week, and yet it is not planted in their heart, and it is evident because they are not acting on it. Sure, they act on the things that agree with their lifestyle, or they act when it is convenient to obey...

But when this Word confronts, challenges, convicts, or tries to change them, they put it aside and forget it, never putting it into action. Be careful if this describes your life because this is not the Christian life. In the Christian life the Word is planted in your heart, and you receive it like blood to your heart, humbly and constantly, and by the grace of God that moves your heart, you obey it.

If we are to use God's mirror profitably, then we must gaze into it carefully and with serious intent. No quick glances will do. We must examine our own hearts and lives in the light of God's Word. This requires time, attention, and sincere devotion. Perhaps one reason we glance into the Word instead of gaze into the Word is that we are afraid of what we might see.

Men are free when they want to do what they ought to do. This is the "splendid paradox" produced by a living faith in the Gospel through the indwelling Holy Spirit.
