"Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, because great is your reward in heaven. For that is how their ancestors treated the prophets.


"But woe to you who are rich, for you have already received your comfort.


Woe to you who are well fed now, for you will go hungry. Woe to you who laugh now, for you will mourn and weep.

The Beatitudes disclose God's gracious favor toward His followers for traits that are opposite of what usually garners acclaim and popularity.

The Beatitudes are not conditions for entering the Kingdom of God but blessings pronounced on those who have already entered.

Poverty vs. Wealth



Listen, my dear brothers and sisters: Has not God chosen those who are poor in the eyes of the world to be rich in faith and to inherit the Kingdom He promised those who love Him?

Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment.

Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share.

In this way they will lay up treasure for themselves as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of the life that is truly life.

The Beatitudes simply cannot be "good news" if they are understood as a set of "how-tos" for achieving blessedness. They would then only amount to a new legalism.

It is the association to Jesus that unlocks the blessings mentioned in the Beatitudes.

"My servants will eat, but you will go hungry;
my servants will drink, but you will go thirsty;
my servants will rejoice, but you will be put to shame.

The Motivation for Jesus Followers (6:22b,23a)



The apostles left the Sanhedrin, rejoicing because they had been counted worthy of suffering disgrace for the Name.
