The Old Testament passages referring to the day of the Lord often speak of both a near and a far fulfillment, as does much of Old Testament prophecy.

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TURNING: A call to **repentance in hopes of avoiding coming judgment.** (2:1–17)

Good eschatology (understanding of God's future plan) leads to great confidence and great urgency, not great fear or great gloating over the outcome of others.



Joel tells us that God's ultimate judgment, which falls on the Day of the Lord, will be "great and terrible. Who can endure it?" (Joel 2:11). The answer is that we, on our own, can never endure such a moment.

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But if we have placed our faith in Christ for atonement of our sins, we have nothing to fear from the Day of Judgment.

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God's judgment is coming, so choose His mercy.
