EXPLORE

- 1 Ephesians 5:22–6:9 is a relational description of how believers live out Paul's directive to "submit to one another out of reverence for Christ" (5:21). What is "submission" in your own words? Why does it have a negative connotation for many people?
- 2 Are the directives for wives and husbands (5:22–33) meant to give guidance for "tiebreakers" in decision-making, offer a pattern for different household responsibilities, or provide an all-encompassing framework for the relationship? Explain your answer.
- Many people assume that God's plans are confining. In this passage, what do you find liberating about God's plan for relationships in the Christian household?
- 4 In our human nature, we are quick to highlight the responsibilities or deficiencies of others while ignoring our own. How can you focus on God's directives to you in this passage?
- 5 How should children who no longer live at home regard the instructions in Ephesians 6:1? What changes or what remains for adult children and their relationship with parents?
- 6 Why might the attitude and effort of believers who follow Ephesians 6:6,7 be powerful in Gospel witness? In what ways might colleagues and supervisors respond to that display?
- 7 In your own words, how do the Gospel and the Spirit affect how we hear and apply these directives?
