EXPLORE

- 1 Twice in Ephesians 6:10–13 Paul urges us to "put on the full armor of God." Four times he urges us to be able to stand or stand firm. Why the repetition and the urgency?
- 2 What are the distortions in our thinking against which Paul is trying to warn us in Ephesians 6:11? Can human beings be evil? If so, why are they not the object of our struggle?
- 3 Although all the pieces of spiritual armor are important (6:14–17), which one stands out to you as most needed in your life?
- 4 Which pieces of the armor are defensive, and which are offensive? Why does that distinction matter?
- 5 The most important word in verse 18 is among the simplest of words "all." Why does Paul repeat it?
- 6 What does it mean to pray "in the Spirit" and "with all kinds of prayers and requests" (6:18)?
- 7 What would it look like in your life and relationships to declare the Gospel "fearlessly" (6:19,20)?
- 8 How is it a comfort and source of confidence that God will give us the words to say as we bear witness to the Gospel (6:20)? Practically, what does it actually look like in the moment for God to give us the words as we bear witness?

PRAY

In light of verses 18 and 19, pray for your brothers and sisters in Christ that they would stand firm in Christ and the Gospel and be bold in their proclamation of the Good News.
